Speaker: Rev. Mike Morran grew up a city kid in Chicago, attending the Unitarian Universalist Church of Evanston, Illinois. Like many UU churches of that time, they were caught up in the social activism of the 1960s, and Mike remembers thinking that religion is what happens when you pitch in with your friends and family to help someone out. Recycling drives, serving soup to the poor, visiting nursing homes, and cleaning up city lots with rakes and garbage bags were early and formative church experiences.

After dropping out of high school and several years of itinerant labor, he started college in his early twenties, spent eight years in engineering, followed by three years working with the mentally ill. Mike lovingly refers to working with the mentally ill as excellent training for the ministry.
